WHAT:

An educational grant project to study the links between transportation and land-use. The grant products will offer alternatives to local decision makers and citizens so they can make better informed transportation and land-use decisions for the long term future health of the Treasure Valley.

WHERE:

The metropolitan region that covers areas in Ada and Canyon counties, surrounding Boise.

WHEN:

The grant runs from July 1, 1999 to December 31, 2000, though the final grant forum may be held early in the year 2001.

WHO:

This innovative project is lead by a diverse and broad-based consortium of interests from around the two county region including: local officials, local, regional and state agencies, citizen interests, non-profit groups, and state universities.

GRANT FACTS:

- Authorized by the Transportation Equity Act for the Twenty First Century (TEA-21) in the Transportation and Community and Systems Preservation Pilot Program (TCSP)
- Granted through The Federal Highway Administration
- Total Amount of Federal Grant: \$510,000, total of local matching donations: at least \$100,000



GRANT OBJECTIVES:

Educate policy makers, advocacy groups, business leaders and citizens about why they should consider all land use and transportation policy decisions in a regional as well as local context and why land use and transportation planning in the Valley must be more closely linked.

Consider how the TCSP program goals will help residents of this valley to attain municipal and personal goals as well as any goals we may identify as a region.

Identify ways to overcome the major barriers currently impeding compact development and efficient infrastructure systems in the Treasure Valley.

Define realistic alternative choices to existing land use and transportation implementation policies in the Treasure Valley so that individual communities can accommodate future growth in a more efficient manner.
