# **Tips for Completing Your Small Learning Community Application**

### What are SLCs?

"SLC" stands for "small learning community." SLCs are programs within high schools where students with the same interests take many of the same classes, have the same teachers, and experience many other things together.

Pick up a High School Guide from your teacher or counselor so that you can read about each SLC. There are a wide variety of SLCs, so talk to your family about what your interests are so that you can choose SLCs that are the right fit for you.

When you've chosen your top three SLCs you will be ready to fill out this application. Make sure and have a counselor, teacher or family (parent or guardian) help you with the application.

# Attendance Area and Citywide SLCs

Attendance Area SLCs are available only to students who live in the neighborhoods surrounding a particular high school. Talk to your school counselor or teacher to find out which is your neighborhood high school, or Attendance Area school.

Citywide SLCs are open to all students no matter where they live. So even if you live in the south area of Minneapolis,

you can still pick an SLC that is located on the north side of town as long as it is marked as a "Citywide" SLC (see inside of application).

International Baccalaureate SLCs (offered at Patrick Henry and Southwest) and Washburn's American Studies Academy have specific geographic boundaries. Turn to the inside of this application for more information on what those boundaries are.

# What if I don't get my top SLC choice?

Once your application is handed in, it will be sent to the SLC that you marked as your top choice. Since there are limited seats available for each of the SLCs, not everyone can get his or her top choice. If you don't get your top choice, your application will then be sent to your second choice. But keep in mind that your second choice might be full, too. Because not all students can get their first or second choice, it is a good idea that your

third choice is an Attendance Area Only SLC from your neighborhood high school. This means your third choice will be a "sure thing."

## Sibling and Employee Preference

Siblings of students already in an SLC and children of Minneapolis Public Schools employees may be eligible for preference placement in an SLC.

In order to be placed in an SLC with entrance requirements, students applying for preference must meet the require-

ments before preference applies.

Furthermore, space and transportation considerations may limit sibling or employee preference if students live outside a school's attendance area. If these preferences apply to you, make sure and fill out the information on the front of this application.

### Your Personal Checklist ✓

- ☐ Before filling in the application, talk to your family about your SLC choices. What do they think? Learn all you can about your options. Is this a good match? Are there other SLCs you should consider?
- ☐ For your top three SLC choices, choose at least one "Attendance Area Only" SLC from your neighborhood high school.
- ☐ Fill out the application clearly and completely.
- □ Hand in everything that is required for your application by December 17! Your teachers and counselors need time to make sure the required information is attached.
- ☐ Make sure your parent or guardian signs the application.

# English Language Learners (ELL)

Bilingual programs (ELL Small Learning Communities) are offered at the high schools listed below. The district's ELL Department recommends that students in Levels Orientation, I and 2 be automatically placed in an ELL SLC at the high school that offers bilingual support

in the student's native language, unless bilingual services are waived.

Students who are Levels 3, 4 and 5 may choose to apply directly to any of the SLCs on the other side of this page as long as they meet the SLC restrictions, such as living in the appropriate attendance area or the SLC entrance requirements. English as a Second Language services are offered at all high schools. Parents are encouraged to call high schools directly to find out exactly what kind of bilingual or other services are available.
